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
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FEATURE STORY

Recently, discussions regarding the immunization of today's children and youth have dominated the news, but very little focus has been given to the importance of immunization for seniors. According to the Department of Health and Human Services, approximately 45,000 adults pass away each year from complications due to vaccinepreventable diseases. For older adults, especially those living in senior communities, the conversation regarding the importance of immunizations should take place between residents, their families, and their primary care provider. Here are a couple of questions to ask as you have this important conversation:

- 1. What are your feelings about immunization? Many seniors are concerned about the side-effects from vaccines, but once they are reminded of their importance, those fears subside.
- 2. What's your immunization history?
 For some seniors, they may never have been immunized as a child.
 Additionally, if seniors haven't received vaccinations recently, immunity to many common diseases may have faded.
- **3. What are your next steps?** From reviewing past immunizations or planning to get that flu shot this fall, seniors that create a plan of action are more likely to follow through.

Here are some vaccine answers from our own Steven Atkinson, PA-C, MS:

What are the most important vaccinations for seniors?

The vaccinations that seniors should ensure they receive include:

- Flu
- Both Pneumococcal Vaccines (Prevnar & Pneumovax)
- Shingles
- Tetanus-Diptheria-Pertussis

Can getting a vaccine actually give me the disease? No, receiving a vaccine for a disease doesn't have the potential to give you that disease. This common misconception is fueled by the fact that many vaccines are made with "inactivated viruses" and some people believe that they were actually being injected with a harmful virus. The reality is that an "inactivated virus" cannot cause harm, it's simply a weakened agent that helps your immune system prepare to fight any true disease.

Are there any harmful side effects from vaccines? No. While minor side-effects like injection site pain and swelling or muscle and joint pain may occur, vaccines that have been approved by your primary care provider are safe, with few major side effects.
